according to the dictates of our own conscience, and allow all men the same privilege, let them worship how, where, and what they may.”

The free exercise of religion affords us the opportunity to strengthen our faith in God and to teach moral values. It is something very precious that we should treasure and safeguard. The gospel of Jesus Christ can be a rudder that helps us to navigate the stormy seas of life. The freedom to

raise our families with a strong faith in God and the principles of a Christ-like life is truly one of the greatest blessings of being an American citizen.

A Healing Church

How did you pray during the recent teachers strike in our community? No doubt many citizens gave prayerful thought to the situation that was affecting our children, our teachers and the harmony of our community. Here’s how two members of the Christian Science church prayed:

“I prayed to see God shepherding and guiding everyone involved to a wise and just resolution. I prayed to see beyond sides and conflict to the fact that everyone could be motivated by love rather than fear or anger, and further prayed to realize that there is no limit to God’s infinite provision for man. In Malachi (3:10) we read, ‘... prove me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts, if I will not open you the windows of heaven, and pour you out a blessing, that there shall not be room enough to receive it.’”

“As I prayed, the idea that the word ‘strike’ insinuates separation came to thought and then a verse from a well loved hymn in the Christian Science hymnal: ‘I fear no tribulation, / Since, whatsoe’er it

be/ It makes no separation/ Between my Lord and me.’ (Carl J. P. Spitta). I reasoned that there could be no separation between God and His idea man. God was governing all in perfect balance. Turning to the Bible I prayed with II Corinthians 8 and 9. The strike being concerned with supply and equality, two lines were especially helpful. They read in part, ‘... now at this time your abundance may be a supply for their want, that their abundance also may be a supply for your want: that there may be equality:’ and ‘God is able to make all grace abound toward you; that ye, always having all sufficiency in all things, may abound to every good work:’ I prayed with these ideas until the strike was resolved.”
